# SECTION 10 - FURNISHING AND DELIVERING TRAFFIC SIGNS

#### I. DESCRIPTION OF WORK

This work shall consist of furnishing and delivering traffic signs in such quantities and to the places designated in the Proposal, all in accordance with the requirements of these specifications.

## II. <u>GENERAL</u>

#### A. Materials

The traffic signs shall meet the requirements of these specifications and Subsection 750.01 of the Standard Specifications as amended or revised. "Standard Specifications" is defined in Section 1.40, Standard Specifications of the Special Provisions. Log on to: http://plonedev.hawaii.gov/dot/highways/specifications2005/sspecprv.htm to review the standard specifications. The Contractor shall utilize the latest revision of the specification from the website.

## B. Measurement and Payment

Traffic signs will be paid for at the contract price per unit, which respective price will be full compensation for all materials, labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to manufacture and fabricate the specified items, all in accordance with these specifications and to furnish and deliver the specified items to the places designated herein.

#### III. <u>DELIVERY</u>

## A. Description

DELIVERY shall mean the <u>transporting</u> to the places designated and <u>unloading</u> of the specified quantities of traffic signs. These materials consigned as indicated in the proposal to the respective recipients shall be delivered to the following addresses:

B. Packaging and Marking.

The material shall be packaged in convenient size containers and marked for shipment in accordance with Section 10.3.A. in the quantities indicated in the Proposal. All cases shall be labeled to allow quick identification of the contents. Labeling shall contain the following information: size, count, Contractor's name, description, contract number, project number, etc.

C. Delivery Schedule

The supply of traffic signs shall be furnished and delivered within the contract time of one hundred fifty (150) calendar days as indicated on Page PF-1 of the proposal to the location as designated.

D. Notification of Delivery

Preceding any delivery of material, the Contractor shall comply with the requirements of Section 10.IV, Certification, of this Contract Specifications. The Contractor shall have the shipper notify the recipient by telephoning the number listed in Section 10.III.A at least two (2) working days in advance as to the day and time of delivery. The time of delivery shall be subject to approval of the recipient.

E. Inspection of Material

The Contractor shall make a visual and physical check of the materials delivered for damage, shortages, etc. Payment will not be processed until the Contractor has satisfied himself and the State that the materials delivered meets the contract requirements.

## IV. CONTRACTOR SUBMITTALS

 Material Certificate of Compliance – As specified in Section 10.III.D of the Specifications, preceding any delivery of material, the Contractor shall submit the applicable Material Certificate of Compliance to Construction and Maintenance Branch, 869 Punchbowl Street, Honolulu, Hawaii 96813 for the applicable material in the Proposal Schedule.

- a. The Material Certificate of Compliance shall certify that the applicable traffic signs delivered conform to the requirements of the specifications. The notarized certificate shall include, as a minimum, the following data:
  - 1. Name of manufacturer
  - 2. Material being certified
  - 3. Batch or lot number
  - 4. Applicable test results of finished products
  - 5. Applicable specifications
  - 6. Date
  - 7. Statement of compliance by a responsible official (employee) of the Manufacturer
  - 8. Project identification.
- b. The certificate of compliance may be reviewed by the Materials and Testing Branch and shall recommend acceptance or non-acceptance. Review process is estimated to be completed as early as five (5) working days but no later ten (10) working days from the time of receipt of the document(s). Construction and Maintenance Branch shall send a letter to the Contractor stating that materials in the Certificate of Compliance are accepted or not accepted. Refer to Section 8.1, Progress of Work, of the Special Provisions of this contract if the materials covered under the Certificate of Compliance are not accepted. Construction and Maintenance Branch shall forward a copy(s) of the approved/accepted Certificate of Compliance to each recipient district.
