 136 used in the contract documents, unless otherwise prescribed therein and without
 137 regards to the use or omission of uppercase letters, the intent and meaning shall
 138 be interpreted as follows:

Addendum (plural - Addenda) - A written or graphic document, including drawings and specifications, issued by the Director during the bidding period.

142 This document modifies or interprets the bidding documents by additions, 143 deletions, clarifications or corrections. 144 145 Addition (to the contract sum) - Amount added to the contract sum by change 146 order. 147 148 Advertisement - A public announcement inviting bids for work to be performed or 149 materials to be furnished. 150 151 Amendment - A written document issued to amend the existing contract between 152 the State and Contractor and properly executed by the Contractor and Director. 153 154 Award - Written notification to the bidder that the bidder has been awarded a 155 contract. 156 157 Bad Weather Day (or Unworkable Day) - A day when weather or other conditions 158 prevent a minimum of four hours of work with the Contractor's normal work force 159 on critical path activities at the site. 160 161 Bag - 94 pounds of cement. 162 163 Barrel - 376 pounds of cement. 164 165 Base Course - The layer or layers of specified material or selected material of a 166 designed thickness placed on a subbase or subgrade to support a surface course. 167 168 Basement Material - The material in excavation or embankments underlying the 169 lowest layer of subbase, base, pavement, surfacing or other specified layer. 170 171 Bid - See Proposal. 172 173 **Bidder** - An individual, partnership, corporation, joint venture or other legal entity 174 submitting, directly or through a duly authorized representative or agent, a 175 proposal for the work or construction contemplated. 176 177 Bidding Documents (or Solicitation Documents) - The published solicitation 178 notice. bid requirements, bid forms and the proposed contract documents including all addenda and clarifications issued prior to receipt of the bid. 179 180 181 **Bid Security** - The security furnished by the bidder from which the State may 182 recover its damages in the event the bidder breaches its promise to enter into a 183 contract with the State, or fails to execute the required bonds covering the work 184 contemplated, if its proposal is accepted. 185 186 Blue Book - EquipmentWatch Cost Recovery (formerly known as 187 EquipmentWatch Rental Rate Blue Book), available from EquipmentWatch, a 188 division of Penton, Inc.

- 190 Calendar Day See Day.191

192 Change Order (or Contract Change Order) - A written order signed by the 193 Engineer issued with or without the consent of the Contractor directing changes in 194 the work, contract time or contract price. The purposes of a change order 195 include, but are not limited to (1) establishing a price or time adjustment for 196 changes in the work; (2) establishing full payment for direct, indirect, and 197 consequential costs, including costs of delay; (3) establishing price adjustment 198 or time adjustment for work covered and affected by one or more field orders; or 199 (4) settling Contractor's claims for direct, indirect, and consequential costs, or for additional contract time, in whole or in part. 200

Completion - See Substantial Completion and Final Completion.

Completion Date - The date specified by the contract for the completion of all
 work on the project or of a designated portion of the project.

207 Comptroller - the Comptroller of the State of Hawaii, Department of Accounting
 208 and General Services.

210 Contract - The written agreement between the Contractor and the State, by -211 which the Contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, and materials and perform 212 the specified work within the contract time stipulated, and by which the State of 213 Hawaii is obligated to compensate the Contractor at the prices set forth in the 214 contract documents.

Contract Certification Date - The Date on which the Deputy Comptroller for the
 State of Hawaii (or authorized representative) signs the Contract Certification.

Contract Completion Date - The calendar day on which all work on the project,
 required by the contract, must be completed. See CONTRACT TIME.

222 **Contract Documents -** The contract, solicitation, addenda, notice to bidders, 223 Contractor's bid proposal (including wage schedule, list of subcontractors and 224 other documentations accompanying the bid), notice to proceed, bonds, general 225 provisions, special provisions, specifications, drawings, all modifications, all 226 written amendments, change orders, field orders, orders for minor changes in the 227 work, the Engineer's written interpretations and clarifications issued on or after the 228 effective date of the contract.

Contract Item (Pay Item) - A specific unit of work for which there is a price in thecontract.

232

Contract Modification (Modification) - A change order that is mutually agreed to
 and signed by the parties to the contract.

Contract Price - The amount designated on the face of the contract for the
 performance of work.

- Contract Time (or Contract Duration) The number of calendar or working days provided for completion of the contract, inclusive of authorized time extensions. Contract time shall commence on the Start Work Date and end on the Substantial Completion Date. If in lieu of providing a number of calendar or working days, the contract requires completion by a certain date, the work shall be completed by that date.

246 **Contracting Officer -** See Engineer.

248 **Contractor** - Any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, joint venture, or 249 other legal entity undertaking the execution of the work under the terms of the 250 contract with the State.

- 252 **Critical Path -** Longest logical sequence of activities that must be completed on 253 schedule for the entire project to be completed on schedule.

- Day Any day shown on the calendar, beginning at midnight and proceeding up
 to, but not including, midnight the following day. If no designation of calendar or
 working day is made, "day" shall mean calendar day.
- Department The Department of Transportation of the State of Hawaii(abbreviated HDOT).

- 262 **Director** The Director of the HDOT acting directly or through duly authorized 263 representatives.
- Plans (or Drawings) The contract drawings in graphic or pictorial form including
 the notes, tables and other notations thereon indicating the design, location,
 character, dimensions, and details of the work.
- Engineer The Highway Administrator, Highways Division, HDOT, or the
 authorized person delegated to act on the Administrator's behalf.
- Equipment All machinery, tools, and apparatus needed to complete the
 contract.
- Field Order A written order issued by the Engineer or the Engineer's authorized
 representative to the Contractor requiring a change or changes to the contract
 work. A field order may (1) establish a price adjustment or time adjustment; or
 (2) may declare that no adjustment will be made to contract price or contract time;
 or (3) may request the Contractor to submit a proposal for an adjustment to the
 contract price or contract time.

Final Acceptance - The Status of the project when the Engineer finds that the Contractor has satisfactorily completed all contract work in compliance with the contract including all plant establishment requirements, and all the materials have been accepted by the State.

Final Completion - The date set by the Director that all work required by the contract has been completed in full compliance with the contract documents.

Final Inspection - Inspection where all contract items (with the exception of
 Planting Period and Plant Establishment Period) are accepted by the Engineer.
 Substantial Completion will be issued by the Engineer based on the satisfactory
 results of the Final Inspection.

Float - The amount of time between when an activity can start and when an activity
 must start, i.e., the time available to complete non-critical activities required for
 the performance of the work without affecting the critical path.

Guarantee - Legally enforceable assurance of the duration of satisfactory
 performance of quality of a product or work.

301

Hawaii Administrative Rules - Rules adopted by the State in accordance with
 Chapter 91 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended.

Highway (Street, Road, or Roadway) - A public way within a right-of-way
 designed, intended, and set aside for use by vehicles, bicyclists, or pedestrians.

Highways Division - The Highways Division of the Hawaii Department of
 Transportation constituted under the laws of Hawaii for the administration of
 highway work.

311

Holidays - The days of each year which are set apart and established as State
 holidays pursuant to Chapter 8 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended.

315 Inspector - The Engineer's authorized representative assigned to make detailed 316 inspections of contract performance, prescribed work, and materials supplied.

317

Laboratory - The testing laboratory of the Highways Division or other testing
 laboratories that may be designated by the Engineer.

Laws - All Federal, State, and local laws, executive orders and regulations having
 the force of law.

323

Leveling Course - An aggregate mixture course of variable thickness used to
 restore horizontal and vertical uniformity to existing pavements or shoulders.

Liquidated Damages - The amount prescribed in Subsection 108.08 - Liquidated Damages for Failure to Complete the Work or Portions of the Work on Time, to be

- paid to the State or to be deducted from any payments payable to or, which maybecome payable to the Contractor.
- 331

Lump Sum (LS) - When used as a payment method means complete payment
 for the item of work described in the contract documents.

Material - Any natural or manmade substance or item specified in the contract to
 be incorporated in the work.

Notice to Bidders - The advertisement for proposals for all work or materials on which bids are required. Such advertisement will indicate the location of the work to be done or the character of the material to be furnished and the time and place for the opening of proposals.

Notice to Proceed - Written notice from the Engineer to the Contractor identifying
 the date on which the Contractor is to begin procuring materials and required
 permits and adjusting work forces, equipment, schedules, etc. prior to beginning
 physical work.

347

348 **Pavement** - The uppermost layer of material placed on the traveled way or
 349 shoulders or both. Pavement and surfacing may be interchangeable.

350

Pavement Structure - The combination of subbase, base, pavement, surfacing
 or other specified layer of a roadway constructed on a subgrade to support the
 traffic load.

354

Payment Bond - The security executed by the Contractor and surety or sureties
 furnished to the Department to guarantee payment by the Contractor to laborers,
 material suppliers and subcontractors in accordance with the terms of the contract.

358

359 Physical Work - Physical construction activities on the project site or at 360 appurtenant facilities including staging areas. It includes (i) building or installing 361 any structures or facilities including, but not limited to sign erection; BMP 362 installation; field office site grading and building; (ii) removal, adjustment, or demolition of physical obstructions on site; (iii) any ground breaking activities; and 363 364 (iv) any utility work. It does not include pre-construction environmental testing 365 (such as water quality baseline measurements) that may be required as part of 366 contract.

367

368 **Pre-Final Inspection** - Inspection scheduled when Contractor notifies Engineer 369 that all physical work on the project, with the exception of planting period and plant 370 establishment period, has been completed. Notice from Contractor of substantial 371 completion will suspend contract time until Contractor receives punchlist from 372 Engineer.

373

374 **Profile Grade -** The elevation or gradient of a vertical plane intersecting the top
 375 surface of the proposed pavement.

377 **Project Acceptance Date** - The calendar day on which the Engineer accepts the
 378 project as completed. See Final Completion.

380 **Proposal (Bid)** - The executed document submitted by a Bidder in response to a
 381 solicitation request, to perform the work required by the proposed contract
 382 documents, for the price quoted and within the time allotted.

384 **Public Traffic -** Vehicular or pedestrian movement on a public way.

386 **Punchlist** - A list compiled by the Engineer specifying work yet to be completed or
 387 corrected by the Contractor in order to substantially complete the contract.

- 389 Questionnaire The specified forms on which the bidder shall furnish required
 390 information as to its ability to perform and finance the work.
 391

Request for Change Proposal - A written notice from the Engineer to the
 Contractor requesting that the Contractor provide a price and/or time proposal for
 contemplated changes preparatory to the issuance of a field order or change order.

- Right-of-Way Land, property, or property interests acquired by a government
 agency for, or devoted to transportation purposes.
- Roadbed The graded portion of a highway within top and side slopes, prepared
 as a foundation for the pavement structure and shoulders.

402 Roadside - The area between the outside edges of the shoulders and the right-of 403 way boundaries. Unpaved median areas between inside shoulders of divided
 404 highways and infield areas of interchanges are included.
 405

- 406 **Section and Subsection -** Section or subsection shall be understood to refer to 407 these specifications unless otherwise specified.
- 408

Shop Drawings - All drawings, diagrams, illustrations, schedules and other data
 or information which are specifically prepared or assembled by or for the
 Contractor and submitted by the Contractor to illustrate some portion of the work.

412

413 Shoulder - The portion of the roadway next to the traveled way for:
414 accommodation of stopped vehicles, placement of underground facilities,
415 emergency use, and lateral support of base and surface courses.

416

417 **Sidewalk** - That portion of the roadway primarily constructed for use by 418 pedestrians.

419

420 **Solicitation -** An invitation to bid or request for proposals or any other document 421 issued by the Department to solicit bids or offers to perform a contract. The

422 solicitation may indicate the time and place to receive the bids or offers and the 423 location, nature and character of the work, construction or materials to be provided. 424 425 Specifications - Compilation of provisions and requirements to perform 426 prescribed work. 427 428 **Standard Specifications.** Specifications by the State intended for (A) 429 general application and repetitive use. 430 431 Special Provisions. Revisions and additions to the standard **(B)** 432 specifications applicable to an individual project. 433 434 Standard Plans - Drawings provided by the State for specific items of work 435 approved for repetitive use. 436 437 State - The State of Hawaii, its Departments and agencies, acting through its 438 authorized representative(s). 439 440 State Waters – All waters, fresh, brackish, or salt, around and within the State, 441 including, but not limited to, coastal waters, streams, rivers, drainage ditches, 442 ponds, reservoirs, canals, ground waters, and lakes; provided that drainage 443 ditches, ponds, and reservoirs required as a part of a water pollution control 444 system are excluded. 445 446 **Start Work Date** - Date on which Contractor begins physical work on the contract. 447 This date shall also be the beginning of Contract Time. 448 449 **Structures** - Bridges, culverts, catch basins, drop inlets, retaining walls, cribbing, manholes, endwalls, buildings, sewers, service pipes, underdrains, 450 foundation drains, and other such features that may be encountered in the work. 451 452 453 Subbase - A layer of specified material of specified thickness between the 454 subgrade and a base. 455 456 Subcontract - Any written agreement between the Contractor and its 457 subcontractors which contains the conditions under which the subcontractor is to 458 perform a portion of the work for the Contractor. 459 460 Subcontractor - An individual, partnership, firm, corporation, or joint venture or 461 other legal entity, as covered in Chapter 444 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, which enters into an agreement with the Contractor to perform a portion 462 463 of the work. 464 465 Subgrade - The top surface of completed earthwork on which subbase, base, 466 surfacing, pavement, or a course of other material is to be placed. 467

468 Substantial Completion - The Status of the project when the Contractor has
 469 completed the work, except for the planting period and plant establishment period,
 470 and each of the following requirements are met:

- 472 (1) All traffic lanes (including shoulders, ramps, sidewalks and bike
 473 paths) are in their final configuration as designed and the final
 474 wearing surface has been installed;
- 476 (2) All operational and safety devices have been installed in accordance
 477 with the contract documents including guardrails, end treatments,
 478 traffic barriers, required signs and pavement markings, drainage,
 479 parapet, and bridge and pavement structures;
- 481 (3) All required illumination and lighting for normal and safe use and
 482 operation is installed and functional in accordance with the contract
 483 documents;
 484
- 485 (4) All utilities and services are connected and working;
- 487(5)The need for temporary traffic controls or lane closures at any time488has ceased, except for lane closures required for routine489maintenance;
- 491 (6) The building, structure, improvement or facility can be used for its intended purpose.

494 Substantial Completion Date - The date the Substantial Completion is granted
 495 by the Engineer in Writing and Contract Time stops.

- 497 Superintendent The employee of the Contractor who is responsible for all the
 498 work and is a Contractor's agent for communications to and from the State.
 499
- 500 **Surety** The qualified individual, firm or corporation other than the Contractor, 501 which executes a bond with and for the Contractor to insure its acceptable 502 performance of the contract.
- 503

- 504 **Surfacing** The uppermost layer of material placed on the traveled way or 505 shoulders. This term is used interchangeably with pavement.
- 506
- 507 Traveled Way The portion of the roadway for the movement of vehicles,
 508 exclusive of shoulders.
 509

510 **Unsuitable Material** - Materials that contain organic matter, muck, humus, peat, 511 sticks, debris, chemicals, toxic matter, or other deleterious materials not suitable 512 for use in earthwork.

513

514 Utility - A line, facility, or system for producing, transmitting, or distributing 515 communications, power, electricity, heat, gas, oil, water, steam, waste, or 516 storm water.

517 518

Utility Owner - The entity, whether private or owned by a State, Federal. or 519 County governmental body, that has the power and responsibility to grant approval 520 for, or undertake construction work involving a particular utility.

- 522 Water Pollutant - Dredged spoil, solid refuse, incinerator residue, sewage, 523 garbage, sewage sludge, munitions, chemical waste, biological materials, 524 radioactive materials, heat, wrecked or discarded equipment, rock, sand, soil, 525 sediment, cellar dirt and industrial, municipal, and agricultural waste.
- 526

527 Water Pollution - (1) Such contamination or other alteration of the physical, 528 chemical, or biological properties of any state waters, including change in 529 temperature, taste, color, turbidity, or odor of the waters, or (2) Such discharge 530 of any liquid, gaseous, solid, radioactive, or other substances into any state 531 waters, as will or is likely to create a nuisance or render such waters unreasonably 532 harmful, detrimental, or injurious to public health, safety, or welfare, including 533 harm, detriment, or injury to public water supplies, fish and aquatic life and 534 wildlife. recreational purposes and agricultural and industrial research and 535 scientific uses of such waters or as will or is likely to violate any water quality 536 standards, effluent standards, treatment and pretreatment standards, or 537 standards of performance for new sources adopted by the Department of Health.

538

539 Work - The furnishing of all labor, material, equipment, and other incidentals 540 necessary or convenient for the successful execution of all the duties and 541 obligations imposed by the contract. 542

- 543 Working Day - A calendar day in which a Contractor is capable of working four or 544 more hours with its normal work force, exclusive of: 545
- 546 (1) Saturdays, Sundays, and recognized legal State holidays and such 547 other days specified by the contract documents as non-working days,
- 549 Day in which the Engineer suspends work for four or more hours (2)550 through no fault of the Contractor."
