138 Amendment - A written document properly executed by the Contractor and 139 Director issued to amend the existing contract between the State and the 140 Contractor. 141 142 **Bag** – 94 pounds of cement. 143 144 Barrel – 376 pounds of cement. 145 Award - Written notification to the bidder that the bidder has been awarded a 146 147 contract. 148 149 Base Course - The layer or layers of specified material or selected material of a 150 designed thickness placed on a subbase or subgrade to support a surface course. 151 152 153 **Basement Material** - The material in excavation or embankments underlying the 154 lowest layer of subbase, base, pavement, surfacing or other specified layer. 155 Bid - See Proposal 156 157 158 **Bidder** - An individual, partnership, corporation, joint venture or other legal 159 entity submitting, directly or through a duly authorized representative or agent, 160 a proposal for the work contemplated. 161 Bidding Documents - The "Notice to Bidders" or the invitation to bid, proposal 162 requirements, the bid form and the proposal contract documents including all 163 164 addenda issued prior to receipt of bids. 165 166 **Bid Security** - The security furnished by the bidder from which the State may recover its damages in the event the bidder breaches its promise to enter into a 167 contract with the State, or fails to provide the required bonds covering the work 168 169 contemplated, if its proposal is accepted. 170 171 Blue Book – "Rental Rate Blue Book for Construction Equipment" published by Equipment Watch, A Premedia Business Directories and Book Group. 172 173 174 Any day shown on the calendar, beginning at midnight and Calendar Day. 175 ending at midnight of the following day. If no designation of calendar or workingday is made, "day" shall mean calendar day. 176 177 178 Change Order - A written order signed by the Engineer that establishes the full payment and final settlement of all claims for direct, indirect, and consequential 179 costs, including costs of delays, and establishes any adjustments to contract 180 time related to the work covered and affected by one or more field orders, or for 181 change work done or agreed to be done without issuance of a separate field 182

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183 order. A change order signed by all parties to the contract constitutes a184 supplemental agreement.

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186 **Completion -** See Substantial Completion and Final Completion.

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188 **Completion Date** - The date specified by the contract for the completion of all 189 work on the project or of a designated portion of the project.

191 **Contract** - The written agreement between the Contractor and the State by 192 which the Contractor is bound to furnish all labor, equipment, and materials and 193 to perform the specified work within the contract time stipulated, and by which 194 the State of Hawaii is obligated to compensate the Contractor therefore at the 195 prices set forth therein.

197 Contract Documents - The contract, addenda, notice to bidders, Contractor's 198 proposal (including wage schedule, list of subcontractors and other 199 documentation accompanying the bid), the notice to proceed, the bonds, these 200 general provisions, the special provisions, the specifications, and the drawings 201 and are more specifically identified in the contract together with all written 202 amendments, change orders, a written order for minor changes in the work and 203 the Engineer's written interpretations and clarifications issued on or after the effective date of the contract 204

206 **Contract Item (Pay Item)** - A specific unit of work for which there is a price in 207 the contract.

208

Contract Performance Bond - The security executed by the Contractor and the
 surety or sureties furnished to the Department to guarantee the completion of
 the work in accordance with terms of the contract.

213 **Contract Price** - The amount designated on the face of the contract for the 214 performance of work including any allowances.

215

216 **Contract Time** - The number of working or calendar days provided in the 217 contract for substantial completion of the contract including authorized time 218 extensions. The number of days shall begin running on the effective date in 219 the notice to proceed. If in lieu of providing a number of working days, the 220 contract requires completion by a certain date, the work shall be completed by 221 that date.

223 **Contractor** - Any individual, partnership, corporation, joint venture, or other 224 legal entity undertaking the execution of the work under the terms of the contract 225 with the State of Hawaii, and acting directly or through its agents, or 226 employees.

227

228 **Critical Path** – Sequence of activities that must be completed on schedule for 229 the entire project to be completed on schedule. 230 231 Department - The Department of Transportation, of the State of Hawaii 232 (abbreviated DOT). 233 Director - The Director of the Hawaii Department of Transportation acting 234 235 directly or through their duly authorized representatives. 236 237 **Drawings** - The contract drawings and plans (including standard plans) which 238 show in pictorial or pictorial form including the notes, tables and other notations 239 thereon the design, location, character, dimensions and details of the Work to be 240 done. 241 Effective Dates and Laws - Reference to government laws, 242 ordinances. 243 regulations, standard specifications, and rules includes amendments thereto 244 effective as of the date of the call for sealed tenders. 245 246 Engineer - The Airports, Harbors, or Highway Administrator or the authorized 247 person designated to act in the Administrator's behalf. 248 249 Equal or Approved Equal - A brand or article, dualified in accordance with Subsection 102.16- - Substitution of Materials and Equipment, that may be 250 251 used in place of the one specified. 252 Equipment - All machinery, tools, and apparatus needed to complete the 253 254 contract. 255 256 Extra Work - (See Subsection 104.03 - Extra Work.) 257 258 Field Order - A written order issued by the Engineer or the Engineer's 259 authorized representative to the Contractor requiring the contract work to be 260 performed in accordance with a change or changes in the work. A field order 261 may (1) establish a price adjustment and/or time adjustment in an amount the Engineer believes is reasonable for the change; dr (2) may declare that the 262 263 Engineer does not intend to adjust contract time or price for the work; or (3) may 264 request the Contractor to submit a proposal for an adjustment to the contract 265 time and/or price by a certain date. 266 267 Final Completion - The date set by the Director that all work required by the 268 contract and any amendments or changes thereto is in full compliance with the 269 contract 270

Includes entire area within the right-of-283 way. 284 Highways Division - The Highways Division of the Hawaii Department of 285 286 Transportation constituted under the laws of Hawaii for the administration of 287 highway work. 288 289 Holidays - The days of each year which are set apart and established as State 290 holidays pursuant to Chapter 8, HRS, as amended. 291 292 **Inspector** - The Engineer's authorized representative assigned to make detailed 293 inspections of contract performance, prescribed work, and materials supplied. 294 295 Laboratory - The testing laboratory of the Highways Division or other testing 296 laboratories that may be designated by the Engineer. 297 298 Laws - All Federal, State, and local laws, executive orders, and regulations 299 having the force of law. 300

Float - The amount of time between when an activity can start and when an

Leveling Course - An aggregate mixture course of variable thickness used to
 restore horizontal and vertical uniformity to existing pavements or shoulders.

- Liquidated Damages The amount prescribed in Subsection 108.08 Failure to
   Complete on Time, and Liquidated Damages to be paid to the State or to be
   deducted from any payments which may become due the Contractor.
- 308 Lump Sum (LS) When used as a payment method means complete payment
   309 for the item of work described in the contract documents.

- 311 Material Any natural or manmade substance or item specified in the contract to312 be incorporated in the work.

Notice to Bidders - The advertisement for proposals for all work or materials on
 which bids are required. Such advertisement will indicate the location of the

work to be done or the character of the material to be furnished and the time and 316 317 place for the opening of proposals. 318 319 Notice to Proceed - Written notice from the Engineer to the Contractor advising 320 it of the date on which it is to begin the prosecution of the work which date shall 321 also be the beginning of contract time. 322 323 **Pavement** - The uppermost layer of material placed on the traveled way or 324 shoulders or both. Pavement and surfacing may be interchangeable. 325 326 Pavement Structure - The combination of subbase. base. pavement, 327 surfacing or other specified layer of a roadway constructed on a subgrade to 328 support the traffic load. 329 330 Payment Bond - The security executed by the Contractor and Surety or Sureties furnished to the State to guarantee payment by the Contractor to 331 332 laborers, material suppliers and subcontractors in accordance with the terms of 333 the contract. 334 335 Plans - See Drawings. 336 337 **Profile Grade** - The elevation or gradient of a vertical plane intersecting the top 338 surface of the proposed pavement. 339 340 Project Acceptance Date - The calendar day on which the Engineer accepts the project as completed. 341 See Final Completion. 342 343 **Project Guarantee -** A guarantee issued by the Contractor to the State. See 344 GUARANTEE. 345 Proposal (Bid) - The executed document submitted by a bidder in the 346 prescribed manner, in response to a request for proposals or invitation to bid, to 347 perform at the prices quoted, for the work specified under the contract, within the 348 349 time prescribed for performance. 350 351 **Public Traffic - Vehicular or pedestrian movement on a public way.** 352 353 **Punchlist -** A list compiled by the Engineer specifying work yet to be completed 354 or corrected by the Contractor in order to substantially complete or finally 355 complete the contract. 356 Questionnaire - The specified forms on which the bidder shall furnish required 357 information as to its ability to perform and finance the work. 358 359

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360 Request for Change Proposal - A written notice from the Engineer to the 361 Contractor requesting that the Contractor provide a price and/or time proposal 362 for contemplated changes preparatory to the issuance of a field order or change 363 order. 364 365 **Right-of-Way** - Land, property, or property interests acquired for or devoted to transportation purposes. 366 367 368 Roadbed - The graded portion of a highway within top and side slopes, 369 prepared as a foundation for the pavement structure and shoulders. 370 371 Roadside - The area between the outside edges of the shoulders and the right-372 of-way boundaries. Unpaved median areas between inside shoulders of divided highways and infield areas of interchanges are included. 373 374 375 Roadway - The portion of a highway, street or road within the limits of 376 construction. 377 378 Section and Subsection - Section or subsection shall be understood to refer to 379 these specifications unless otherwise specified. 380 381 Shop Drawings - All drawings, diagrams, illustrations, schedules and other 382 data or information which are specifically prepared or assembled by or for Contractor and submitted by Contractor to illustrate some portion of the work. 383 384 385 **Shoulder** - The portion of the roadway next to the traveled way for: 386 accommodation of stopped vehicles, placement of underground facilities, 387 emergency use, and lateral support of base and surface courses. 388 389 Sidewalk - That portion of the roadway primarily constructed for use by 390 pedestrians. 391 392 Specifications - Compilation of provisions and requirements to perform 393 prescribed work. 394 395 (A) Standard Specifications. Specifications by the State intended 396 for general application and repetitive use. 397 398 **(B)** Special Provisions. Revisions and additions to the standard 399 specifications applicable to an individual project. 400 401 Standard Plans - Drawings provided by the State for specific items of work approved for repetitive use. 402

404 State - The State of Hawaii, its Department and agencies, acting through its 405 authorized representative(s). 406 407 Structures - Bridges, culverts, catch basins, drop inlets, retaining walls, cribbing, manholes, endwalls, buildings, sewers, service pipes, underdrains, 408 foundation drains, and other such features that may be encountered in the work. 409 410 411 Subbase - A layer of specified material of specified thickness between the 412 subgrade and a base. 413 414 Subcontract - Any written agreement between the Contractor and its subcontractors which contains the conditions under which the subcontractor is to 415 perform a portion of the work for the Contractor. 416 417 418 Subcontractor. An individual, partnership, firm, corporation, or joint venture 419 or other legal entity as covered in Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which enters into an agreement with the Contractor to perform a portion of the Work. 420 421 422 Subgrade - The top surface of completed earthwork on which subbase, base, 423 surfacing, pavement, or a course of other material is to be placed. 424 425 Substantial Completion - The point at which the project is complete such that it can be safely and effectively used by the public without unreasonable delays. 426 427 disruption. or impediments. For the conventional bridge and highway work. 428 the point at which all bridge deck, parapet, pavement structure, shoulder, permanent signing and markings, traffic barrier, and safety appurtenance work 429 430 is complete. 431 Superintendent - The employee of the Contractor who is responsible for all the 432 433 work and is a Contractor's agent for communications to and from the State. 434 435 Surety - The qualified individual, firm, or corporation, other than the Contractor, which executes a bond with and for the Contractor to insure its acceptable 436 performance of the contract. 437 438 439 Surfacing - The uppermost layer of material placed on the traveled way or shoulders. This term is used interchangeably with pavement. 440 441 442 Traveled Way - The portion of the roadway for the movement of vehicles, exclusive of shoulders and auxiliary lanes. 443 444 Unsuitable Material - Materials that contain organic matter, muck, humus, 445 beat, sticks, debris, chemicals, toxic matter, or other deleterious materials not 446 447 suitable for use in earthwork unless otherwise specified. 448

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449 **Utility** - A line, facility, or system for producing, transmitting, or distributing 450 communications, power, electricity, heat, gas, oil, water, steam, waste, or 451 storm water.

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453 Utility Owner – The entity, whether private or owned by a State, Federal, or
454 County governmental body, that has the power and responsibility to grant.
455 approval for or undertake construction work involving a particular utility.

457 **Work** - The furnishing of all labor, materials, equipment, and other incidentals 458 necessary or convenient for the successful execution of all the duties and 459 obligations imposed by the contract.

461 **Working Day** – A calendar day in which a Contractor is capable of working four 462 or more hours with its normal work force, exclusive of:

(1) Saturdays, Sundays, and recognized legal State holidays and such other days specified by the contract documents as non-working days,

468 (2) Days in which the Engineer suspends work for four or more hours
 469 through no fault of the Contractor."
