Proposals will be received at the Contracts Office, Department of Transportation, 869 Punchbowl Street, Honolulu, Hawaii 96813.

The State of Hawaii, Department of Transportation (HDOT), is requesting proposals for the KUHIO HIGHWAY, INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS FOR KAUAI CORRECTIONAL COMMUNITY CENTER AND WAILUA GOLF COURSE project. This is a **Design-Build** project. To be eligible for award, Proposers must possess a valid State of Hawaii General Engineering Contractor's "A" license at the time of award of the contract. Estimated project cost is between \$1,000,000 and \$3,000,000.

A non-mandatory pre-proposal meeting will be held at 9:00 a.m., May 29, 2012, at the Kauai Highways Division, Conference Room, 7720 Haleukana Street, Lihue, Hawaii, 96766, Hawaii. Representative(s) from the prime firms making up the Proposer's-design team are requested to attend. Scope of Work: The project includes design and construction services to improve safety on Kuhio Highway (Route 56) in the vicinity of the driveway entrances to Wailua Golf Course (WGC) and Kauai Community Correctional Center (KCCC). Work consists of constructing intersection improvements that include but are not limited to, widening the roadway section to accommodate, acceleration and deceleration lanes; lengthening and/or relocating left turn storage lanes; constructing improvements to the driveway approaches to both WGC and KCCC; and resolving localized drainage problems. Other work consists of, but is not limited to the design and construction of pavement markings, traffic signs, guardrails, highway lighting, landscape planting, relocation/installation of utilities; and also addressing mitigation of archaeological sites within the project limits, providing temporary and permanent Best Management Practices (BMP), and processing permits required to complete the project in conformance with appropriate, State, and local standards.

Award of Contract: The project will be awarded to the Proposer deemed to offer the Best Value to HDOT based on the Qualifications Evaluation, Design Concept Evaluation, and Price Evaluation. Attention is directed to Section IV - Proposal of the Technical Provisions.

Proposers shall submit proposals (qualifications, design concept documents, and prices) to the Contracts Office no later than 2:00 p.m., June 18, 2012. Additionally, HDOT may conduct interviews with each Proposer to provide the Proposer an opportunity to present their design concept and to answer any questions HDOT may have.

The above project is subject to preference for Hawaii products established by Section 103D-1002, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Hawaii Product List may be examined at the State Procurement Office, State Office Building.


