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## "SECTION 101 - TERMS, ABBREVIATIONS, AND DEFINITIONS

101.01 The specifications are generally written in the Meaning of Terms. imperative mood. In sentences using the imperative mood, the subject, "the Contractor shall", is implied. In the material specifications, the subject may also be the supplier, fabricator, or manufacturer supplying material, products, or equipment for use on the project. The word "will" generally pertains to decisions or actions of the State and/or Engineer.

**101.03 Definitions.** Whenever the following words or terms are used in the contract documents, unless otherwise prescribed therein and without regards to the use or omission of uppercase letters, the intent and meaning shall be interpreted as follows:

**Addendum (plural - Addenda) -** A written or graphic document, including drawings and specifications, issued by the Director during the bidding period which modify or interpret the bidding documents, by additions, deletions, clarifications or corrections which shall be considered and made a part of the bid proposal and the contract when executed.

**Addition** (to the contract sum) - Amount added to the contract sum by change order.

**Advertisement** - A public announcement inviting bids for work to be performed or materials to be furnished.

**Completion Date** - The date specified by the contract for the completion of all work on the project or of a designated portion of the project.

**Contract** - The written agreement between the Contractor and the State by which the Contractor is bound to furnish all labor, equipment, and materials and to perform the specified work within the contract time stipulated, and by which the State of Hawaii is obligated to compensate the Contractor therefore at the prices set forth therein.

Contract Documents - The contract, addenda, notice to bidders, the instructions to bidders, Contractor's proposal (including wage schedule, list of subcontractors and other documentation accompanying the bid), the notice to proceed, the bonds, these general provisions, the special provisions, the specifications, and the drawings and are more specifically identified in the contract together with all written amendments, change orders, a written order for minor changes in the work and the Engineer's written interpretations and clarifications issued on or after the effective date of the contract.

Contract Item (Pay Item) - A specific unit of work for which there is a price in the contract.

**Contract Performance Bond -** The security executed by the Contractor and the surety or sureties furnished to the Department to guarantee the completion of the work in accordance with terms of the contract.

**Contract Price -** The amount designated on the face of the contract for the performance of work including any allowances.

**Contract Time** - The number of working or calendar days provided in the contract for substantial completion of the contract including authorized time extensions. The number of days shall begin running on the effective date in the notice to proceed. If in lieu of providing a number of working days, the contract requires completion by a certain date, the work shall be completed by that date.

**Contractor** - Any individual, partnership, corporation, joint venture, or other legal entity undertaking the execution of the work under the terms of the contract with the State of Hawaii, and acting directly or through its agents, or employees.

Department - The Department of Transportation, of the State of Hawaii (abbreviated DOT).

Director - The Director of the Hawaii Department of Transportation acting directly or through their duly authorized representatives.

**Drawings** - The contract drawings and plans (including standard plans) which show in pictorial or pictorial form including the notes, tables and other notations thereon the design, location, character, dimensions and details of the Work to be done.

**Effective Dates and Laws** - Reference to government laws, ordinances, regulations, standard specifications, and rules includes amendments thereto effective as of the date of the call for sealed tenders

**Engineer** - The Airports, Harbors, or Highway Administrator or the authorized person designated to act in the Administrator's behalf.

**Equal or Approved Equal -** A brand or article, qualified in accordance with Subsection 102.16- – Substitution of Materials and Equipment, that may be used in place of the one specified.

**Equipment** - All machinery, tools, and apparatus needed to complete the contract.

Extra Work - (See Subsection 104.03 - Extra Work.)

**Field Order** - A written order issued by the Engineer or the Engineer's authorized representative to the Contractor requiring the contract work to be performed in accordance with a change or changes in the work. A field order may (1) establish a price adjustment and/or time adjustment in an amount the Engineer believes is reasonable for the change; or (2) may declare that the Engineer does not intend to adjust contract time or price for the work; or (3) may request the Contractor to submit a proposal for an adjustment to the contract time and/or price by a certain date.

Final Completion - The date set by the Director that all work required by the contract and any amendments or changes thereto is in full compliance with the contract

**Structures** - Bridges, culverts, catch basins, drop inlets, retaining walls, cribbing, manholes, endwalls, buildings, sewers, foundation drains, and other such features that may be encountered in the work.

**Subbase** - A layer of specified material of specified thickness between the subgrade and a base.

Subcontract - Any written agreement between the Contractor and its subcontractors which contains the conditions under which the subcontractor is to perform a portion of the work for the Contractor.

**Subcontractor.** An individual, partnership, firm, corporation, or joint venture or other legal entity as covered in Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which enters into an agreement with the Contractor to perform a portion of the Work.

**Subgrade** - The top surface of completed earthwork on which subbase, base, surfacing, pavement, or a course of other material is to be placed.

 Substantial Completion - The point at which the project is complete such that it can be safely and effectively used by the public without unreasonable delays, disruption, or impediments. For the conventional bridge and highway work, the point at which all bridge deck, parapet, pavement structure, shoulder, permanent signing and markings, traffic barrier, and safety appurtenance work is complete.

**Superintendent** - The employee of the Contractor who is responsible for all the work and is a Contractor's agent for communications to and from the State.

**Surety** - The qualified individual, firm, or corporation, other than the Contractor, which executes a bond with and for the Contractor to insure its acceptable performance of the contract.

Surfacing - The uppermost layer of material placed on the traveled way or shoulders. This term is used interchangeably with pavement.

Traveled Way - The portion of the roadway for the movement of vehicles, exclusive of shoulders and auxiliary lanes.

**Unsuitable Material - Materials that contain organic matter, muck, humus,**446 peat, sticks, debris, chemicals, toxic matter, or other deleterious materials not
447 suitable for use in earthwork unless otherwise specified.
