The project includes constructing an Office Building, a Maintenance Building, a Storage Building with Storage Shed and an Equipment Shed.

Plans and specifications may be examined and borrowed at the appropriate offices. Borrowed plans and specifications shall be returned in good condition within 30 calendar days after the bid opening date.

To be eligible to bid, bidders must possess a valid State of Hawaii General Building Contractor's "B" license.

Bidder's notice of intention to bid must be received at said Contracts Office no later than 4:30 P.M., 10 calendar days prior to the bid opening date. If the tenth day is on a Saturday, Sunday or State holiday, the notice of intention is due on the last working day prior to the due date. Fax notice is acceptable provided the Contracts Office receives the faxed notice within the time stated above. The fax number is (808) 587-2132. It is the bidder's responsibility to


ensure that the Contracts Office receives the notice of intent on time and in a legible condition.

Each proposal shall be on a form furnished by said Department.

Estimated construction cost is between \$ 1 million - \$ 5 million.

The above project is subject to preference for Hawaii products established by Section 103D-1002, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Hawaii Product List may be examined at the State Procurement Office, State Office Building.

The State reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive any defects in said proposals for the best interest of the public.
