The project includes furnishing and installing a cloud based Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS), including controllers, a travel time system, cellular communications, conflict monitor units, system monitors, and all necessary equipment, programming, and data to provide a fully functional system that meets the contract specifications. Estimated construction cost is between \$1,000,000 and \$3,000,000.

Licensing is not required to bid; however, electrical work must be performed by a licensed Contractor possessing a valid State of Hawaii Engineering Contractor's "A" license or Specialty Contractor's "C-13" or "C-15" license.

The Hawaii Products Preference pursuant to Act 175, SLH 2009, is applicable to this project. Persons wishing to certify and qualify a product as a Hawaii Product shall submit a Certification for Hawaii Product Preference (SPOForm 38) to the DOT Contracts office no later than 4:30 P.M., fourteen (14) calendar days prior to the bid opening date. Late submittals for this project will not be reviewed by the DOT. A separate SPO-Form 38 shall be completed and submitted for each product. A 5% bid adjustment for bidders that are parties to apprenticeship agreements pursuant to Section 103-55.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), is applicable to this project.

If a product listed in the Hawaii Products List is available and meets project specifications, such product will be designated in the contract documents as a qualified product which may be used in the performance of the project.

If the bidder intends to claim preference for products on the Hawaii Product List and such is not listed, the bidder shall immediately notify the Contracts Office, Department of Transportation, so the Engineer may take corrective or other appropriate actions.

It is further understood by the bidder that if the bidder elects to furnish qualified Hawaii Products, and is awarded the contract, then fails to use such products or meet the requirements of such preference, the bidder shall be subject to the statutory penalties. provided in HRS Chapter 103D-1002, and such other remedies as may be available to the State.

For the purpose of determining the lowest bid price only, the provisions of HRS Chapter 103D-1002 shall apply. Any contract awarded or executed in violation of HRS Chapter 103D-1002 shall be void and no payment shall be made on account of such contract.

- 2. Econolite There's possibly a 5-year commitment to be bonded, with the potential for an additional 3 years (Section 770.01.33). When will the bond be released? Will it be for the full 5 years or can they be released after a certain period?
 - a. DOT We'll look into this on a follow-up Addendum.
 - b. ATA follow-up response Bonding requirement to remain as stated in Special Provisions.
- 3. Shah Electrical contractors may not have those capabilities, to meet the bonding requirements.
 - a. DOT We'll look into this on a follow-up Addendum.
 - b. ATA follow-up response Bonding requirement to remain as stated in Special Provisions.

- 4. Econolite When can we provide all our questions/comments?
 - a. ATA We would like to have any follow-up questions by Thursday, June 1st, so we can package the addenda by Friday, June 2nd.
- 5. Econolite Econolite's Cobalt controller supersedes the model 2070-1C. Will DOT accept this (Cobalt) in place of 2070-1C?
 - a. DOT Econolite will need to submit something to DOT to say that it meets the identified controller spec requirements, such as meeting/exceeding the CalTrans requirement (Qualified Products List).
- 6. Econolite Travel Time system is cloud based and tied to the ATMS. Do we need a 5 year license agreement?
 - a. DOT We'll look into this on a follow-up Addendum.
 - b. ATA follow-up response Travel Time system licensing updated in Addendum.
- 7. Econolite There's a requirement of 10% spare parts (Plan Sheet C-2). Is this in addition to the 80 controllers? So do we need 88 controllers?
 - a. DOT Bidding 80 intersections with 10% spares. All wires, cables, hardware. This includes 10% additional bluetoads.
 - b. Econolite So this is 8 extra hardware components, but not ATMS or system monitors?
 - c. DOT Affirmative.
- 8. Econolite CMU mentioned, but can't find any directions on it.
 - a. DOT Need to add in addendum, to furnish and install CMU's.
