SEALED BIDS for **SOUTH KIHAI ROAD PAVEMENT REHABILITATION, LIPOA STREET TO AUHANA ROAD AND KEONEKAI ROAD TO KILOHANA DRIVE, FEDERAL AID PROJECT NO. STP-3100(16), DISTRICT OF KIHAI, ISLAND OF MAUI**, will be received and **time stamped** by the Bid Receiver, Purchasing Division, Department of Finance, Wells Street Professional Center, 2145 Wells Street, Suite 104, Wailuku, Maui, Hawaii 96793, until 2:00 P.M., _____ at which time and place the sealed proposals will be publicly opened and read.

The project includes removal and replacement of asphalt pavement, installation of concrete curb, gutter, and sidewalk, removal and replacement of curb ramps, installation of pavement striping and markers, and installation of cured-in-place pipe inside existing drainlines.

Bids received after the established due date and time will not be considered.

To be eligible for award, bidders must possess a valid State of Hawaii General Engineering Contractor's "A" license prior to the award of the contract. Bidders shall be licensed in accordance with Chapter 444, HRS, relating to the licensing of contractors.

The U.S. Department of Transportation Regulation entitled "Nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted Programs of the U.S. Department of Transportation," Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 21 is applicable to this project. Bidders are hereby notified that the County will affirmatively ensure that the contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder without discrimination on the grounds of race, color, national origin and sex (as directed by 23 CFR Part 200). The Equal Employment Opportunity Regulations of the Secretary of Labor implementing Executive Order 11246, as amended shall be complied with on this project.
