If remains are found, work shall cease in the immediate vicinity of the find and the find shall be protected from further damage. The Archaeologist shall immediately contact the State Historic Preservation Division (808) 692-8023, which will access the significance of the find and recommend appropriate mitigation measures, if necessary.

The Contractor shall submit to the Engineer a copy of the qualified Archaeological firm's valid Archaeological permit prior to the Notice to Proceed date. Additionally, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer a copy of the qualified Archaeological firm's valid Archaeological permit every subsequent calendar year by the first working day in January of that calendar year.

Measurement. The Engineer will measure archaeological monitoring, 212.04 including remedial measures to document and/or preserve finds, on a force account basis, in accordance with Subsection 109.06 - Force Account Provisions and Compensation.

The Engineer will pay for the accepted archaeological 212.05 monitoring by a qualified archaeologist or firm, including necessary remedial measures on a force account basis in accordance with Subsection 109.06 - Force Account Provisions and Compensation. Payment will be full compensation for work
