BOARD OF WATER SUPPLY NOTES

- 1. Unless otherwise specified, all materials and construction of water system facilities and appurtenances shall be in accordance with the City and County of Honolulu, Board of Water Supply's "WATER SYSTEM STANDARDS" VOLUME 1, DATED 1985, THE "APPROVED MATERIAL LIST AND STANDARD DETAILS FOR WATER SYSTEM CONSTRUCTION", VOLUME 2, DATED 1985, THE "WATER SYSTEM EXTERNAL CORROSION CONTROL STANDARDS", VOLUME 3, DATED 1991, and all subsequent amendments and additions.
- 2. All plans approved by the Board of Water Supply are based solely on the adequacy of the water supply. All other features of the water system, such as lines, grades, fittings, drainage, etc., and other features of improvements shall not be the responsibility of the Board of Water Supply.
- 3. The existence and location of underground utilities and structures as shown on the plans are from the latest available data but is not guaranteed as to the accuracy or the encountering of other obstacles during the course of the work. The Contractor shall be responsible and shall pay for all damages to existing utilities. The Contractor shall not assume that where no utilities shown, that none exist.
- 4. The Contractor shall be responsible for the protection of all water lines during construction. The Contractor shall be especially careful when excavating behind water lines, tees, and bends wherever there is a possibility of water line movement due to removal of the supporting earth beyond the existing reaction blocks. The Contractor shall take whatever measure necessary to protect the water lines, such as constructing special reaction blocks (with BWS approval) and/or modifying his construction method.
- 5. Re-approval shall be required if this project is not under construction within a period of two (2) years.
- 6. The Contractor shall notify BWS Planning and Engineering Division, Construction Section in writing and submit four (4) sets of approved construction plans one week prior to commencing work on the water system. (Revised 6/98)
- 7. The Contractor shall verify all existing service lateral locations whether shown or not shown on plans prior to commencing with any of the work and shall not assume that where no service laterals are shown none exists.
- 8. Prior to any excavating, the Contractor shall verify in the field the location of existing water mains and appurtenances.
- 9. Any adjustments to the existing water system required during construction to meet requirements of BWS Standards, whether shown on the plans or not, shall be done by the Contractor at no cost to the Board of Water Supply.
- The Contractor shall have existing water mains toned before construction of work in vicinity of water mains, call the investigation section at 527-5296 for toning services. Guardrail post locations are to be kept to a minimum clear distance of 18 inches to any 2-1/2 Inch water lines and meter boxes. No post driving will be allowed when post is to be installed closer than 3 feet from water main. Excavated areas shall be restored to their original condition.
- 11. Prior to installation, the Contractor shall submit for approval by Board of Water Supply, the manufacturer's certification that all cast iron (gray or ductile) fittings for the project conform in all respects to the Water System Standards, dated 1985.
- 12. All ductile iron pipe, fittings and valves shall be wrapped with two (2) layers of 8 mil. polyetheylene wrap.
- 13. Test pressure shall be <u>150</u> psi.
- 14. Ball corp and ball stop shall be used in lieu of a corporation stop and stopcock respectively. (Added 7/21/97)

- 15. The Contractor shall cut and plug all existing unused laterals at the main whether or not shown on the plans. The damaged area shall be repaired to an equal or better condition than the immediate area. All work shall be done at the expense of the Contractor.
- 16. Polygon shape for mechanical joint glands as described in AWWA Standard C111 shall be "straight-sided" or an approved equal on a job to job basis.
- 17. Pipe cushion shall be of high resistivity material. The contractor shall submit a soil certification that high resistant cushion material has a resistivity greater than 5,000 OHM-CM. Remainder of the backfill material shall be as specified in Volume 1 of the Water System Standards. Pipe cushion and backfill material shall contain no hazardous substances above regulatory action levels including but not limited to lead, asbestos, mercury, chromium, cadmium, zinc, strontium, and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB). (Revised/Added 8/28/96)
- 18. For waterlines crossing existing or new ductlines:
 - i.) At the electrical/signal ductline water crossings, adjust all electrical/signal ductline elevations to maintain 6" vertical clear separation from all waterlines (12" clear for all electrical/signal ductline structures larger than 16") at no cost to the Board of Water Supply.
 - ii.) Maintain 3'-0" min. horizontal clear separation between all waterline system and nearest electrical/signal ductlines paralleling the water system at no cost to the Board of Water Supply.
 - iii.) Maintain 3'-0" min. horizontal clear separation between street light/traffic signal, standards (including any modular units) and the nearest water system. The Contractor shall field verify for any conflicts at each street light/traffic signal standard location. Where conflicts occur, the contractor shall coordinate with the project engineer to revise the street light/traffic signal standard to provide the required clearances at no cost to the Board of Water Supply.
- 19. For cut-in connection to existing:
 "All waterline construction requiring shutdown connection shall be scheduled for <u>AFTER</u> working hours at <u>SIX</u> (6) hours maximum downtime."
- 20. The Contractor/Developer shall obtain a NPDES permit prior to chlorination and/or dewatering. A copy of the permit shall be submitted to the Board of Water Supply, Planning and Engineering Division, Construction Section.
- 21. The contractor shall chlorinate the entire inside surface of each pipe and fitting with disinfection solution of 5 ounces of sodium hypochlorite mixed with 10 gallons of water. (For connection only)
- 22. The contractor shall follow the following revised chlorination and water sampling procedures:
 - A. The following chlorination and water sample collection procedure shall apply to all water pipeline projects:
 - Step 1: Chlorinate main by filling with water and introducing chlorine in sufficient quantity to obtain a minimum chlorine concentration of 50 parts per million. Leave chlorinated water in main overnight.
 - Step 2: Flush main with fresh water until all chlorine has been flushed out as evidenced by the ortho-tolidine test, then collect a water sample while continuing to flush the main.
 - Step 3: Repeat Steps 1 and 2. After collecting the second water sample, stop flushing and allow the water to stand in the main overnight.
 - Step 4: Thoroughly flush the main with fresh water until all water that had been standing in the main overnight has been flushed out. Stop flushing and let the water stand in the main for one (1) hour. Collect a water sample.

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- B. The main is deemed acceptable and certified when (1) two consecutive water samples, collected 24 hours apart under Steps 1 and 2, show no total and fecal coliform and less than 200 colony forming units (CFU) of total bacteria and (2) the sample of water held in the main for one hour, collected under Step 4, also shows no total and fecal coliform and less than 200 CFU total bacteria.
- C. Chlorination, flushing, sampling and testing will be extended should unsatisfactory results be encoutered. Any sample that shows positive coliform presence or total bacteria greater than 200 CFU is unsatisfactory.
- D. Steps 1 and 2 may be repeated before collecting the one hour hold sample specified in Step 4. Repeating Steps 1 and 2 is recommended in the event samples show the presence of coliforms and/or increasing total bacterial results from one sample to the next.
- E. Water samples that show the presence of atypical colonies, debris or results inconsistent with existing water are subject to reconfirmation. BWS reserves the right to request and test additional water samples in the interest of safeguarding public health and safety.



GENERAL CONSTRUCTION NOTES

- A. Trenching to be by hand digging near and across existing utility lines.
- B. Unless otherwise requested by the Board of Water Supply, minimum clearance between water lines and conduits shall be:

 Horizontal = 3 feet

 Vertical = 6 inches
- C. Adjust new conduit alignment, if required to provide clearances. If conduit cannot be realigned, adjustments to existing water system shall be performed in accordance with standards of the Board of Water Supply.
- D. Minimum clearance between highway light standards and fire hydrants shall be 3 feet.
- E. Underground utilities shown hereon are for information only. No quarantee is made on the accuracy or completeness of said information.
- F. All new and existing concrete pullbox and handhole covers which are located in new finished sidewalks shall be provided with new exposed aggregate concrete covers to match new exposed aggregate concrete sidewalk finish.
- G. Where necessary, reconstruction of sidewalk, gutter and driveway areas shall conform to the standard details of the governmental agency having jurisdiction over the work.
- H. The Contractor shall be responsible for removal of all silt and debris resulting from his work and deposited in drainage facilities, roadways and other areas. The cost for any necessary remedial action by the Chief Engineer shall be payable by the Contractor.
- I. The Contractor, at his own expense, shall keep the project area free from dust nuisance. The work shall be in conformance with the air pollution control standards and regulations of the State Department of Health.

HAWAIIAN ELECTRIC COMPANY NOTES

- 1. The location of HECO's overhead and underground facilities shown on the plans are from existing records with varying degrees of accuracy and are not guaranteed as shown. The Contractor shall exercise extreme caution whenever construction crosses or is in close proximity of underground lines and shall maintain a minimum 13'-0" clearance when operating equipment within or under any overhead lines.
- 2. The Contractor shall comply with the State of Hawaii's Occupational Safety and Health law (DOSH).
- 3. The Contractor shall obtain an excavation permit from HECO's Customer Installation Department located at 820 Ward Avenue, 4th Floor, two weeks prior to starting construction.
- 4. The Contractor to stakeout all facilities for verification by the utility involved and/or affected before proceeding.
- 5. All manholes, pullboxes and ductlines to be installed in concrete, shall be inspected and approved by the utility company before placing concrete. Notify utility company 48 hours prior to placing concrete.
- 6. All completed ductlines shall be mandrel tested by the Contractor in the presence of the utility company's inspector using the utility company's standard practice.
- 7. The Contractor shall install a $\frac{1}{8}$ " polyolefin pull line in all completed HECO and CATV ductlines after mandrel testing is complete.
- 8. The Contractor shall be responsible for all proposed work within private property to enable the conversion from overhead to underground. The Contractor shall coordinate all work with the utility companies.
- 9. The Contractor shall give HECO forty (40) working days notice to proceed with it's portion of the work.
- 10. Barricading of HECO's facilities, if required, shall be done by Contractor.

 Breaking into existing HECO facilities shall be done by HECO.
- 11. HECO shall remove all existing HECO facilities except as noted on the plans.
- 12. HTCO shall be the JP removal company.

HAWAIIAN ELECTRIC COMPANY NOTES (Continued)

- 13. The following terms will be used interchangeably throughout this project:

 a. HTCO or "T" for Hawaiian Telephone Company
 - b. HECO or "E" for Hawaiian Electric Company
 - c. Oceanic Cable or "V" for Oceanic Cablevision
- 14. The Contractor shall furnish his construction schedule forty-five (45) working days prior to starting any HECO work.
- 15. For verifying the location of underground ductlines and for assistance in providing proper support and protection of underground ductlines, the Contractor shall contact the HECO underground division at 543-7871 or 543-7345, a minimum of 72 hours in advance. Location and depth of all handholes and manholes shall be verified and approved in the field by HECO prior to excavation, construction, or installation.
- 16. When trench excavation is adjacent to or under existing structures or facilities, the Contractor is responsible for properly sheeting and bracing the excavation and stabilizing the existing ground to render it safe and secure from possible slides, cave-ins and settlement, and for properly supporting existing structures and facilities with beams, struts or underpinning to fully protect it from damage.
- 17. Any work required to relocate HECO facilities shall be done by HECO and the Contractor shall be responsible for all coordination, and for costs if applicable.
- 18. Should it become necessary to temporarily relocate any HECO facilities to enable the Contractor to perform his work in a safe and expeditious manner in fulfilling his contract obligations, these temporary relocations will be done by HECO, or by the Contractor under HECO's supervision, with all costs being borne by the Contractor.
- 19. Any damage to HECO's facilities shall be reported immediately to HECO's trouble dispatcher at 543-7874.
- 20. All HECO overhead and underground facilities shown on these plans or whose approximate locations within the project boundaries have been made known by reasonable means. All HECO facilities shall be protected at all times by the Contractor during construction. Costs for damages to HECO facilities shall be borne by the Contractor. This repair work shall be done by HECO, or by the Contractor under HECO's supervision.

21. CAUTION!!! ELECTRICAL HAZARD!!!!

Existing electrical facilities, overhead lines and underground encased buried duct lines are energized and will remain energized during construction. Cables in service boxes, transformer vaults and handholes are also energized. Only Hawaiian Electric Company personnel are to handle these energized cables and erect temporary guards to protect cables from damage. Contractor shall work cautiously to avoid accidents and damage to existing facilities. Contractor shall coordinate his work with HECO u.g. division (phone: 543-7871 or 543-7345) and inspection division (phone: 543-4356).

- 22. The Contractor shall furnish and install all materials to complete construction of the underground ductline system, including riser conduits. All electric ducts shall be encased in concrete jacket unless otherwise specified. All ducts and conduits shall be inspected and approved by HECO prior to placing concrete. The Contractor shall notify HECO's inspection division (phone 548-4356) at least 24 hours prior to placing concrete.
- 23. The Contractor is to stake out all temporary & permanent new pole locations so as not to conflict with any existing or proposed utility for HECO approval. The Contractor shall be responsible for cost incurred by conflicting utilities.
- 24. The Contractor shall install Schedule 40 PVC conduit for all HECO ductline, no split ducts will be allowed. No notching of HECO boxes will be allowed.
- 25. HECO to receive 75 working days notice for any relocation work.
- 26. When excavating near utility poles, the Contractor shall protect, support, secure and take all other precautions to prevent damage to or leaning of these poles. Contractor is responsible for all costs associated to repair or straighten pole.
- 27. For construction of underground facilities refer to HECO Specification CS7003 and CS7001.
- 28. All duct line installation shall be concrete encased, Schedule 40 PVC.

- 29. The underground pipes, cables or ductlines known to exist by the Engineer from his search of records are indicated on the plans. The Contractor shall verify the locations and depths of the facilities and exercise proper care in excavating the area. Wherever connections of new utilities to existing utilities are shown on the plans, the Contractor shall expose the existing lines at the proposed connections to verify their locations and depths prior to excavation for the new lines.
- 30. Locations of all existing handholes and service boxes are approximate and exact location shall be determined in the field.
- 31. The Contractor shall provide two sets of as-built reproducible tracings showing the offsets, stationing and vertical elevation of the duct line(s) constructed. One set is for the State Department of Transportation, Highways Division and the other is for the Hawaiian Electric Company.
- 32. The Contractor shall use proper care in excavating the area. He shall be responsible for any damage to surface or underground facilities whether shown or not shown on the plans.
- 33. All manholes shall be cast in place unless approved by HECO.



HAWAIIAN TELEPHONE COMPANY GENERAL CONSTRUCTION/DESIGN NOTES

- 1. The Contractor shall procure and pay for all licenses and permits and shall give all notices necessary and incident to the due and lawful prosecution of the work.
- 2. The Contractor shall obtain an excavation permit and toning request from GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's Excavation Permit Section, located at 3239 Ualena Street, third floor, two weeks prior to the start of construction. Hours of business are 7:00 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. Monday through Friday, except holidays.
- 3. Prior to the excavation of the ductline, the contractor shall request the GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company to locate existing ductline wherever required. For underground cable locating and marking, five (5) working days advance notice is required. Three (3) working days advance notice is required for any inspection by a designated representative.
- 4. The locations of existing utilities are approximate only. The Contractor shall exercise extreme caution and shall maintain proper clearances whenever construction crosses or is in close proximity of GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company facilities. The Contractor shall verify their locations and shall be liable for any damages to GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company facilities. Any damages shall be reported immediately to GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's repair section at #611 (24 hours) or to the excavation permit section at 840-1444 (normal working hours, Monday through Friday, except holidays). As a result of his operations, adjustments to the new duciline alignment, if required, shall be made to provide the required clearances.
- 5. The Contractor shall take necessary precaution not to damage existing cables or ducts. A GTE Hawaiian Telephone inspector or designated representative is required to be at any job site whenever there will be a breakage into or entry into any structure that contain GTE Hawaiian Telephone facilities. Temporary cable and duct supports shall be provided wherever necessary.
- 6. The Contractor shall notify GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's inspector or designated representative a minimum of 72 hours prior to excavation, bracing, or backfilling of GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's structures or facilities.
- 7. All applicable construction work shall be done in accordance with the "GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company Standard Specifications for Placing Underground Telephone Systems" dated March 1999. All subsequent amendments and additions, and all other pertinent standards for telephone construction. Contractor shall familiarize his personnel by obtaining applicable specifications.
- 8. When excavation is adjacent to or beneath GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's existing structures or facilities, the contractor shall:
 - a) Sheet and/or brace the excavation to prevent slides, cave-ins, or settlements to ensure no movement to GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's structures or facilities.
 - b) Protect existing structures and/or facilities with beams, struts, or underpinning while excavating beneath them to ensure no movement to GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company's structures or facilities.
- 9. The Contractor shall brace all poles or light standards near the new ductline, manhole, or handhole during his operations.

- 10. The Contractor shall saw-cut A.C. pavement and concrete gutter wherever new manholes, handholes, or ductlines are to be placed and shall restore to existing condition or better.
- 11. The Contractor shall comply with the policy adopted by the Department of Public Works, City and County of Honolulu, concerning the replacement of concrete sidewalks after excavation work.
- 12. The underground pipes, cables, or ductlines known to exist by the engineer from his search of records are indicated on the plans. The Contractor shall verify the locations and depths of the facilities and exercise proper care in excavating in the area. Wherever connections of new utilities to existing utilities are shown on the plans, the Contractor shall expose the existing lines at the proposed connections to verify their locations and depths prior to excavation for the new lines.
- 13. Wherever connections to existing utilities are shown on the plans, the contractor shall expose the existing lines prior to excavation of the main trenches to verify their locations and depths.
- 14. The Contractor, at his own expense, shall keep the project and surrounding area free from dust nuisance. The cost for supplementary measures, which will be required by the City and County, shall be borne by the Contractor.
- 15. The Contractor shall pump all manholes dry during final inspection.
- 16. The Contractor shall notify the GTE Hawaiian Telephone Company inspector 24 hours prior to the pouring of concrete or backfilling.
- 17. When connecting to manhole walls, all existing reinforcing bars shall be left intact. Ducts shall be adjusted in the field in order to clear reinforcing.
- 18. The Contractor shall be responsible for laying out all required lines and grades and shall preserve all bench marks and working points necessary to lay out the work correctly. The new ductline shall be adjusted by the Contractor to suit the existing conditions and the details as described in the plans.
- 19. Minimum concrete strength shall be:
 For ductline 2500 psi at 28 days
 For manhole 3000 psi at 28 days or as specified in design notes
- 20. Bends in the duct alignment, due to changes in grade shall have a minimum radius of 25 feet. All 90 degree C-bends at a pole or at the building floor slab penetration, shall have a bend radius of ten times the diameter of the duct or greater.
- 21. After ductline has been completed, a mandrel with a square front not less than 12" long and having a diameter of 1/4" less than the inside diameter of the duct, shall be pulled through each duct after which a brush with stiff bristles shall be pulled through to make certain that no particles of earth, sand, or gravel have been left inside. Ducts shall be completely dry and clean.
- 22. All ducts and conduits shall have an 1800# polyester mule-tape (NEPTCO, WP1800P, GTE Hawaiian Telephone Material Code No. 571154) installed throughout its entire length. All ducts shall be capped to prevent entry of foreign material during construction and at the completion of installation.

- 1. Plastic Warning Tape Shall be 8-Mil Colored Orange Not Less Than 4" Wide Along Entire Length of Trench. Tape Shall Read: "WARNING-STOP DIGGING-CALL GTE COMMUNICATION CABLE BURIED BELOW, FAILURE TO COMPLY COULD RESULT IN LEGAL ACTION".
- 2. Type "A" Backfill Material shall be Beach Sand, Earth, or Earth and Gravel. If Earth and Gravel used, the maximum shall contain not more than 50% by Volume of Rock Particles. Maximum 8" Loose Fill per Lift. Obtain 95% Compaction for each Lift.
- 3. If Trench is located in Sidewalk Areas, The Contractor shall replace the 21/2" AC Pav't, the 6" Base Course, and the 7" Subbase with 4" Reinforced Conc. Sidewalk, 4" Bed Course Material, and Type "A" Backfill Material.





- 4. If Trench is located in an Unpaved Area outside Sidewalk Areas, the Contractor shall replace the 2½" AC Pav't, the 6" Base Course, and the 7" Subbase with Type "A" Backfill
- 5. Concrete for Encasement of the Ducts shall be 3000 psi Compressive Strength @ 3 Days.
- 6. Base Course and Subbase per 1994 State Standard Specifications for Highway Construction.
- 7. The Contractor shall coordinate this work with HTCo. The Contractor may begin backfilling the Conduit Trench when the Concrete reaches 3000 psi Compressive Strength after 3 Days.



TYPICAL TRENCH AND BACKFILL SECTION WITH CONCRETE ENCASED DUCTS




